b. ITC/WVEF –United Nation's International Trade Centre sponsored Women Vendors Exhibition & Forum. This forum was created by UN/ITC to promote small to medium women entrepreneurs in developing as well as developed countries. Delegates attending the Women Vendors Exhibition and Forum 2012 held at Mexico's Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Mexico City had struck more than 60 business deals with a total value of more than US\$6 million. PRIA Global's role was to define, design and conduct and chair this annual international program for its Built Environment sector.
